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

<sup>2</sup> God also said to Moses, “I am the LORD (Yahweh). <sup>3</sup> I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob as God Almighty (’ēl šadday), but by my name the LORD (Yahweh) I did not make myself fully known to them.
